<u>The Importance of Attendance</u>

Regular absence from school can have a major impact on a child's education, their future and their life chances. There is strong evidence to show that absence has a serious impact on:

- A child's performance in tests and examinations
- They will fail to meet their full potential.
- Life choices are increased both academically and socially

Regular attendees find school routines, schoolwork and friendships easier to cope with and find these can be built and sustained. Regular attenders are more successful in transferring between primary and secondary school, higher education and employment.

Parents can help their children by:

- Creating good routines at home.
- Making sure their Children arrive at school on time.
- Making time to encourage their children and show interest in their work.
- Communicating with the school any problems that may affect attendance
- Adhering to the school attendance policy and avoiding absence from school.
- Setting realistic boundaries and sanctions related to school attendance. Informing the school on the first day of absence and maintaining contact.
- Giving positive messages about school attendance in formative years to contribute to better management of adolescent years.

Our gates close at 9am, pupils arriving after this time will be marked as $\mathbb L$, late. The registers close at 9.10am, pupils arriving after this time will be marked $\mathbb U$ late after registers close, which is an unauthorised absence.

Attendance Facts:

100% - If your child attends school 100% of the time they will be able to make the best of the opportunities available to them

- Children who attend school more than 95% of the time are more likely to gain 5+ good >95% - Children who GCSE's or equivalent

2 time per month — A child who misses school just twice per month will lose out on 18 days' education across the school year—that's nearly four weeks of schooling 90% - A child who has 90% attendance across their entire schooling will have missed one year's

education! This makes it harder for them to make progress

>90% - Attendance below 90% is considered as 'persistent absentee'. Where there is persistent absence, an attendance action plan may be put in place and the Education Welfare Service may become involved.
